



WOMEN, PEACE AND SECURITY

Our goal: Break cycles of violent conflict through inclusive, democratic peacemaking.

Why: Women are excluded from high-level decision-making. Implementation of gender justice lags behind rhetoric. Money spent on arms could be spent on health, education and the environment. Sexual / gender violence is endemic.

How: WILPF's PeaceWomen programme monitors the UN, helping keep a gender perspective in prevention, disarmament, peacekeeping, policymaking and reconstruction. In the UK, WILPF campaigns for a feminist foreign policy.

HUMAN RIGHTS

Our goal: Prevent and confront war/ armed conflict. We advocate an international Human Rights approach, integrating peace and security with women’s human rights.

Why: We seek to change the conflict narrative thus solving its root causes.

How: WILPF links rights, justice, participation, disarmament and development locally, nationally and internationally as our integrated approach to peace. In the UK, WILPF tracks the Convention for the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), campaigns against TTIP and works with asylum seekers, refugees and trafficked women.

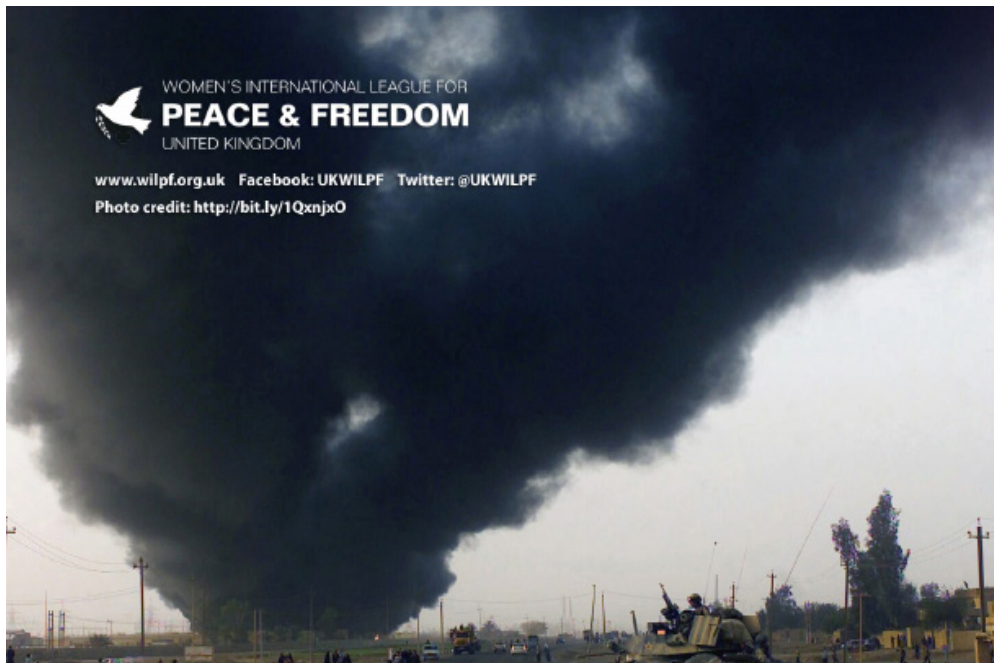
ENVIRONMENT AND MILITARISM

Our goal: Transform ideas of security from that of military might into human rights, justice and peace for all.

Why: Military activities devastate the environment - urban and rural. Air, food, water, DNA - all are affected. As primary carers, women bear the brunt of these changes.

How: Incorporate gender analysis into work on environmental degradation, particularly resource pollution, land control disputes and mass migration, with a focus on that caused by military action, including the development, production and sales of arms.







DISARMAMENT

Why: Nine countries possess more than 16,000 nuclear weapons. Global military expenditure is more than \$1.7 trillion US dollars per year. At least 1,500 people are killed every day by armed conflict.

How: WILPF works towards peace, security, justice and equality through our Reaching Critical Will programme which includes analysis of gendered aspects of weapons and war. In the UK, WILPF is a member of No Trident Renewal networks, the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), and campaigns against drones, killer robots and excessive government military expenditure.
